As we write this, on the afternoon of April 16, 2020, Governor Phil Murphy's latest press conference is being televised, in which he just announced that **New Jersey schools will stay closed until at least May 15**.

So this brief notice is just to inform you and confirm as early as possible that High Point School will continue on with our distance learning plan on April 20, as school resumes following the end of Spring Break.

"I've made this decision in careful consultation with @NJDeptofHealth and @NewJerseyDOE, among other key stakeholders. I know this is hard. But we are saving lives and we must maintain the course."
