NJ Schools to Remain on Home Instruction Through End of School Year

On Monday, May 4, 2020, Governor Murphy announced that all New Jersey schools will not reopen for in-person instruction this school year and that students will continue on remote learning plans until the end of the 2019–2020 school year.
